This document contains some helpful information to help you become more knowledgeable about the future of Grand Targhee Resort and our products and offerings.

Master Development Plan

We have identified a need to improve the recreational experience and address the shortcoming in our terrain offerings and operations to remain viable in a competitive skier and snowboarder market. To meet guests' expectations of the growing skier markets in Idaho and Wyoming, we must continue developing and improving our terrain, guest service offerings, and to meet the needs of our valley.

We love the mountain just as much as our fellow skiers and riders, and we respect the process that goes into accepting and approving development. There are phases to the development plan, which are intended to grow sustainably and in a way that addresses the guest experience with a moderate growth in visitation that will sustain a healthy business model. Every aspect of the development has and will continue to follow the necessary guidelines outlined by the Caribou-Targhee National Forest and Teton County, Wyoming.

Currently, the resort is in phase 1 of the development plan and has begun construction this past summer. The resort added a new parking lot this summer which has increased parking by 30%. State of the art Mountain Operations Facility is in the final stretch of construction. The installation of the new six-passenger Doppelmayr high-speed lift began this summer. The tower foundations, top and bottom terminal grading, power supply, fiber conduits, and communication line installation have all been successfully completed.

The Caribou-Targhee National Forest (CTNF) is preparing an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) to consider and disclose the anticipated environmental effects of implementing the Grand Targhee Master Development Plan (MDP) Projects. This MDP was submitted to and accepted by the CNTF in 2019. The plan includes a host of projects proposed by Grand Targhee Resort to increase recreational offerings and improve the year-round recreational experience. While most of these projects would occur within the resort's existing Special Use Permit (SUP) area, there are two areas along the southeast and southwest border of the SUP area (Mono Trees and South Bowl) where Grand Targhee Resort is proposing a boundary adjustment. These findings from the EIS are scheduled to be released in February.

Grand Targhee Resort Mandatory Vaccination or Weekly Testing Policy

Purpose

In accordance with Grand Targhee Resort's duty to provide and maintain a workplace that is free of known hazards, we are adopting this policy to safeguard the health of our employees and their families, our customers and visitors; and the community at large from infectious diseases, such as COVID-19 that may be reduced by vaccinations. This policy will comply with all applicable laws and is based on guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and local health authorities, as applicable.

Scope

All employees are required to receive vaccinations unless a reasonable accommodation is approved or submit to weekly COVID-19 testing. Employees not in compliance with this policy will be placed on unpaid leave until their employment status is determined by the Human Resources department.

Procedures

All employees must maintain and provide written proof that they have been fully vaccinated against COVID-19 upon becoming eligible for COVID-19 vaccination or submit to free weekly on-site COVID-19 testing. Employees must provide proof of full vaccination to Human Resources by no later than 12/17/2021. Employees that have not provided proof of full vaccination or proof of receiving an initial vaccination shot by 11/14/2021 must submit to weekly testing beginning 11/15/2021. Note that employees should not provide proof of vaccination that includes any genetic information (e.g., family medical history). Any documentation received by an employee will be kept confidential to the extent required by law.

New hires must present proof of COVID-19 vaccination if vaccines are available, and the employee is eligible on or before their first day of employment or must submit to weekly testing beginning the first offered testing date following their first day of employment.

This policy is mandatory except for employees with a documented medical and/or religious reason for not receiving the COVID-19 vaccine. The process for seeking an exemption or reasonable accommodation based on a medical and/or religious reason is addressed below.

Grand Targhee may provide vaccinations on-site to employees free of charge, whether or not an individual has health insurance. Although free off-site vaccinations are widely available, if any charges are incurred that are not covered by the employee's insurance Grand Targhee Resort will reimburse the employee given proper documentation.

All employees will be paid for time taken to receive vaccinations. For off-site vaccinations, employees are to follow the resort's attendance policy and work with their managers regarding compensation for their time. Employees are encouraged to utilize free on-site vaccinations if available.

Before the stated deadlines to be vaccinated have expired, employees will be required to provide either proof of vaccination or an approved reasonable accommodation to be exempted from the requirements.

Requests for Exemptions as a Reasonable Accommodation

An employee or job applicant (i) who has a qualifying medical condition that contraindicates a COVID-19 vaccination, or (ii) who objects to being vaccinated on the basis of a sincerely held religious belief, observance, or practice may request an exemption from this vaccination policy. All requests should be directed to Human Resources.

Grand Targhee Resort will engage in an interactive process to determine if an exemption as a reasonable accommodation may be appropriate. An accommodation will only be granted for the vaccination. Those provided accommodations would need to submit to weekly testing as a reasonable accommodation. This

process will involve exchanging information about the reasons for the request (e.g., information regarding the disability) and identifying appropriate workplace accommodations (e.g., remote work, if possible).

An exemption to vaccination as a reasonable accommodation may be provided so long as it does not cause an undue hardship for the organization or pose a direct threat to others' health and safety. This determination will be made on a case-by-case basis. Any medical information concerning an employee's or job applicant's limitations and/or reasonable accommodation needs will be kept in strict confidence in compliance with applicable federal, state, and local laws. Please refer to our reasonable accommodation procedure for further information. Employees and job applicants may request an exemption as a reasonable accommodation without fear of retaliation.

Please direct any questions regarding this policy to the Human Resources department.

Testing Procedures

Non-vaccinated employees must submit to weekly testing beginning 11/15/2021. Employees must utilize the free on-site testing provided by Grand Targhee Resort through the local healthcare provider. Testing will occur weekly and scheduled testing times will be communicated appropriately. Employees may not use outside testing to comply with this policy unless authorized in advance by Human Resources. Employees that have not provided proof of full vaccination or proof of receiving an initial vaccination shot by 11/14/2021 must submit to weekly testing beginning 11/15/2021.

Proof of Vaccination and Test Results

Employees may submit proof of vaccination directly to Human Resources electronically or in person. Human Resources will review the document and will notify the employee if the document does not meet proof of vaccination standards. Test results will be submitted to Human Resources either directly from the employee or the health care provider.

Non-compliance

An employee who does not provide proof that they have been fully vaccinated for COVID-19 (e.g., received two doses of either the Moderna or Pfizer vaccines or one dose of the Johnson and Johnson vaccine) after becoming eligible under the state's vaccine distribution plan, or not submitting to weekly testing will be considered non-compliant with this policy. Non-compliance will not be tolerated.

This provision does not apply to an employee who has been provided an exemption as a reasonable accommodation for a medical condition or a sincerely held religious belief. In the event that an employee is unable to receive a vaccine due to factors outside of their control (e.g., lack of vaccine supply), contact Human Resources.

COVID FAQ

Do I have to get tested on-site or can I go to another healthcare provider?

- You must get tested on-site unless you have obtained prior approval from Human Resources.

What kind of COVID test will be provided?

- Shallow nasal swab

The testing is not provided during my shift time, what should I do?

- Regardless of if the testing is being offered during your shift, you will need to plan to be at the Resort once a week during the provided testing days/times.

How do I get access to my COVID test results?

- You will be provided a unique login for a secure portal

Is there a cost to get a COVID test?

- Weekly COVID testing is free, and employees will not be charged if testing at the Resort.

Do I have to get tested on weeks that I am not working?

- If there are weeks you are not working, you are not required to test. You must provide a negative test before your shift up to 7 days prior.

What happens if one of my COVID tests come back positive?

- Human Resources will be notified, and you will be asked to follow the CDC guidelines that will be communicated by Human Resources.

Can I show proof of vaccination any time during the Winter season?

- Yes, if you decide to get vaccinated later you may show proof of vaccination to Human Resources. You will be required to submit to weekly testing until you provide proof

HR FAQ

How do I clock in?

- Clock in on a timeclock using your 6-digit employee-id. Clock in on a desktop using the UKG timeclock browser app with your UKG username and password.

How do I know what my number is to clock in?

- Your clock in number is printed on your pass. You can also find your employee id by logging into UKG and viewing it next to your name.

Where are the timeclocks?

- Sprung Locker North Door, F&B Locker area, & housekeeping laundry room

When do we get paid?

- Bi-Weekly payroll ending on Sundays. Pay day is every other Friday and includes hours worked for the two weeks leading up to the previous Sunday.

How do I view my pay statement?

- Log into UKG and navigate to My Pay > Pay History

What if I think something is wrong on my paystub?

- Notify your manager immediately so they can investigate and let the payroll manager know.

- Employee & volunteer passes are printed during business hours at the Activity Center.

You must have signed the Employee Pass Agreement in UKG or offer letter assigned in UKG to pick up your pass. Please list dependent passes on your offer letter or pass agreement.

Dependent Passes: You must provide proof to HR in the form of a marriage certificate or tax document claiming dependents to obtain dependent passes.
